

At a meeting of the Educational Meeting of the Yearly Meeting held 11th Mon 13th 1899. The Cornuth Academy asking for \$300, and the Public School for \$15 to lengthen the school term. After the representatives of the two schools had stated their side of the question they were requested to withdraw and the committee then considered very carefully the situation coming to the conclusion that, as those parents who were sending their children to the Public School were out of unity and harmony with their meeting, we would not give them any help this year but would grant Cornuth Academy \$250 with the hope that every thing possible would be done to conciliate and bring into unity those who had started the Public School. There being no time to consider the needs of the other meetings of the Yearly Meeting it was decided to leave them to the Executive Committee. - ~~then adjourned~~
