

4th There appears a good degree of care among friends, to live within the bounds of their circumstances, and we have no complaint respecting the other parts of this Query.

5th Friends are generally clear in the observance of our testimony against Slavery, except in two instances one of which is under care (the other the Woman Friend only 2 members) and suitable provisions, with some school learning appears to be mostly extended to those under the care of friends.

6th Offenders appear to be dealt with in a good degree of consistency with the Query.

It appears agreeable to the recommendation of the yearly Meeting relating to friends employing Slaves, or taking such Children into their families to bring up who have not been emancipated, the care has been taken by our respective Monthly Meetings to investigate this important subject, who report clear except in two instances, one of which is under care.

The friends appointed to attend the opening of the monthly Meeting for the Western District did also to set with friends at their monthly Meeting for the Eastern District report they all attended.

We appoint as Representatives to the Yearly Meeting Mary Brock, Mary Hopkins, Mary Kirk, Mary Price, Mary Baldwin, Cassandra Whitt, Jane Wilson, Frances Hopkins, Elizabeth Gillingham and Martha Carey, by whom we send \$31.02 cents toward the yearly meeting stock.

No further business. This Meeting concludes.
