1st Our meetings for Worship and Discipline have
been held (with an exception from one meeting)
and attended by the generality of our members
some deficiency acknowledged on week days
unbecoming behaviour generally guarded against
the hour nearly observed

2nd Many friends maintain love towards each other
as becomes our Christian profession True hearing
& abstinence discouraged, when differences arise care
is extended.

3rd We believe there is a cure resorted to the minds
of many friends to endeavour both by example &
precept to educate those under their care in plainness
of speech deportment and apparel also to discourage
the reading of pernicious books & the corrupt conver-
sation of the world also to encourage the frequent reading
of the Holy Scriptures

4th Clear as far as appears of importing vending
distilling and the unnecessary use of spirituous
liquors of frequenting Taverns and places of diversion
a good degree of moderation and temperance ob-
served by many

5th The necessities of the poor are inspected and in
a good degree relieved and some care taken of the
School education of their children

6th Friends appear to maintain a testimony against
an hiring ministry, Oaths, Military Services, clandes-
tine trade, prize goods & Lotteries

7th Friends appear careful to live within the
bounds of their circumstances, to avoid involving
themselves in business beyond their ability to manage
punctuality is observed in the fulfilment of con-
tracts No deficiency apparent as respects the
latter part of the query

8th Friends are mostly careful to bear a testimo-
ny against Slavery & to provide for those under
their direction who have had their freedom secured
an increasing care is felt to instruct them in useful
learning
