Elizabeth Lancaster were appointed to attend the service thereof, by whom we send \$4 dollars & 2 cents as our quota toward the yearly meeting stock.

1st Ans^r All our meetings for worship and discipline have been ~~kept up~~ (except four miss. at three small tranches, one during the time of the yearly meeting) and attended by a considerable part of our members, yet some are unimprovement in this important duty; unbecoming behaviour generally avoided, and the hour of meeting nearly observed.

2nd Ans^r Love is in a good degree maintained toward each other as becomes our Christian profession, calumniating and detraction discouraged by many friends. No apparent differences amongst us.

3rd Ans^r Many friends endeavour by example and precept to educate their children and those under their care in plainness of speech, deportment and apparel; to guard them against reading pernicious books and from the corrupt conversation of the world, and they encouraged frequently to read the

holy scriptures yet a more lively interest in these important duties, we believe, would be conducive to the welfare of society.

4th Ans^r Care of vending and the unnecessary use of spirituous liquors, of frequenting taverns or attending places of diversion, moderation and temperance observed by many friends.

5th Ans^r The necessities of the poor are inspected and measurably relieved, and the school education of their children promoted.

6th Ans^r Mostly careful to maintain our testimony against an kneeling ministry, dear as far as appears respecting the latter part of the query.

7th Ans^r Many friends are careful to live within the bounds of their circumstances, and to avoid involving themselves in business beyond their ability to manage, and as far as appears, justice and punctuality are in a good degree observed.

8th Ans^r Our testimony against slavery is maintained as far as appears, many under our care suitably provided for, and some attention paid to instruct them in useful learning.

9th Ans^r Offenders are dealt with nearly answerable to the query.
