Summary Answers

1st Ans^r All our meetings for worship and discipline
(except two at one small branch) have been held, and attended
by the most of our members on first day mornings, other
meeting sometimes small, unbecoming behaviour mostly
avoided, and the hour nearly observed. No report
from the Elfts since last quarter.

2nd Ans^r Many friends maintain love toward each
other as becomes our Christian profession; talebearing
and detraction, mostly discouraged, and when dif-
ferences arise endeavours are used to end them.

3rd Ans^r Many friends endeavour by example
and precept to educate their children and those
under their care, in plainness of speech, deportment
and apparel, to guard them against reading per-
nicious books, and from the corrupt conversation of
the world, and they encouraged frequently to read
the holy scriptures, yet attention to these important
duties, not sufficiently regarded by all.

4th Ans^r As far as appears friends are clear, as res-
pects the forepart of that query, and moderation
and temperance mostly observed.

5th Ans^r The necessities of the poor are inspected
and they mostly relieved, and the school education
of their children generally attended to.

6th Ans^r Our testimony against an hiring
ministry, generally supported as far as appears,
we know of no breach respecting the other part of the query.
