At Baltimore Quarterly meeting of Friends held at Hopewell, 6 month 16. 1836.

By Report from the M^o M^gs the following Friends are the Representatives, viz;

From Baltimore - Joseph King Jr, John Scott, Miles White & Thomas R Matthews.

From Hopewell - John Griffith, Mah Sander, Isaac Tammy & Joseph N Tollippe.

From Deer Creek - Isaac Moore & Geo P Cook who were present except one for whose absence a reason was rendered.

The 1st, 2nd, 5th & 9th Queries were read in this meeting with the answers to them from the M^o M^gs from which the following summary was taken to represent the state of the M^g.

1st Au^t. all our meetings for worship & discipline have been held, those on first day mornings are generally well attended, but those in the afternoon & middle of the week are small. Unbecoming behaviour therein is mostly avoided & the hours of meeting observed by most of our members. 2nd Au^t. Friends appear careful to maintain love towards each other becoming our christian profession, talebearing & detraction are discouraged & we know of no differences among us, except in regard to those who have separated from us.

9th Au^t. We believe care is mostly taken to deal with offenders as recommended by the Query.

Hugh Balderston on behalf of the Com^c set apart in the 3rd Mo last to visit Deer Creek M^o M^g & advise & assist it in reference to the separation in its limits, reported that may has not opened for any service therein & under a continued concern & sympathy on
