2^d Ans. Friends appear to maintain strictness each other becoming our Christian Profession, Tale hearing and detraction discouraged, No differences amongst us.

3^d Ans. Friends mostly endeavor by example and precept to bring up their children and those under their care in the nurture and admonition of the Lord and in the plainness of Speech department and apparel which the gospel enjoins: to guard them against reading pernicious books and from the corrupt conversation of the world, and they encourage them to read the Holy Scriptures.

4th Ans. We believe that our testimony to a free gospel Ministry is maintained with some few exceptions.

5th Ans. Our testimony against distilled Spirits liquors is maintained so far as we know, frequenting taverns and attending places of diversion we believe are avoided and Moderation and temperance are generally observed.

6th Ans. The necessities receive attention as occasion calls for it.

7th Ans. Friends maintain against Cakes Military Services, clandestine trade, Prize goods lotteries and Slavery, Those of the African race under our care are suitably provided for.
