Our beloved friend Samuel Lloyd attended this meeting with a Minute from Barclay Monthly Meeting, endorsed by Cottonwood Quarterly Meeting, Kansas. His company & gospel services were acceptable to us.

All the Queries were read with the answers from the Monthly Meetings, and the following summary answers adopted to be forwarded in our report to the Yearly Meeting, and to attend therewith as our Representatives we have appointed John C. Thomas Thos. R. Matthews Jr, James Carey, Joseph Edge, Wm. A. Cook, John Griffith, Wm. Akin & James Carey Jr, who were directed to report to our next meeting.

1st Ans. All of our meetings for Worship & Discipline have been held, except two for Worship & one for Discipline, mentioned in our Report. Those on First-day mornings have been duly and punctually attended by our members generally; those on First-day evening & in the middle of the week have not been

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so well attended. Unbecoming behavior has been avoided, with the exception of some sleeping mentioned in our Report.

2nd Ans. We believe Friends have maintained love towards each other becoming our Christian profession; tale-bearing and detraction have been discouraged, and no differences have been known amongst us.

3rd Ans. We believe that most Friends by example & precept have endeavored to bring up their children & those under their care, in the nurture & admonition of the Lord, & in that plainness & simplicity of life which the Gospel enjoins. They have endeavored to guard them against reading pernicious books and from the corrupt conversation of the world, & have encouraged them frequently to read the Holy Scriptures.

4th Ans. We believe our Testimony to a free Gospel Ministry has been maintained.

5th Ans. We believe that, with a few exceptions, Friends have maintained our testimony against the use of all intoxicating drinks & have avoided drinking houses & frivolous & demoralizing places of diversion.

6th Ans. The necessities of the poor have been inspected, and relief afforded when needed.

7th Ans. Friends children have been placed at school, & when practicable, in schools under the care of Friends.

8th Ans. We believe Friends have maintained a faithful testimony against Oaths, Military Services, Lelandine Trade, Prize Goods, Lotteries & Slavery.

9th Ans. Friends have appeared to be careful
