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the following summary answers adopted to be forwarded in our report to the Yearly Meeting; and to attend therewith as our Representatives we have appointed John Nicholson, John C. Thomas, George L. Scott, N. Newlin Smith, Samuel Wright, Edw. L. Jolliffe, Samuel R. Neave & Wm. J. Schofield, who are directed to report to our next meeting.

Ans. 1st. All of our meetings for worship & discipline have been held, & Friends generally have been punctual in their attendance. Two reports state that the mid-week meetings are not so well attended as is desirable.

Ans. 2. Friends, we believe, maintain love towards each other becoming our Christian profession. Tale-bearing & detraction are discouraged. No differences known amongst us.

Ans. 3rd. Most Friends endeavor by example & precept, to bring up their children & those under their care in the nurture & admonition of the Lord, & in the plainness & simplicity of life which the Gospel enjoins. They endeavor to guard them against reading pernicious books and from the corrupt conversation of the world, & they are encouraged frequently to read the Holy Scriptures.

Ans. 4th. Our testimony to a free Gospel ministry has been maintained agreeably to our Discipline

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Ans. 5th. With a few exceptions, mentioned in our report, Friends have maintained our testimony against the use of all intoxicating liquors, & have avoided drinking houses and frivolous & demoralizing places of diversion.

Ans. 6. The necessities of the poor have been inspected, and when needed advice & relief have been afforded.

Ans. 7. Friends' children have been placed at school, & when practicable, in schools under the care of Friends.

Ans. 8. With some qualification in our report, Friends maintain a faithful testimony against oaths, military services, clandestine trade, prize goods, lotteries & slavery.

Ans. 9. Friends have been careful to live within the bounds of their circumstances, & to avoid involving themselves in business beyond their ability to manage or engaging in hazardous or speculative trade. We believe they have been just in their dealings & punctual in complying with their engagements, with one or two exceptions mentioned in our report, to which care has been extended.

Ans. 10. Care has generally been taken to deal with offenders seasonably, & when done, it has been impartial & in the spirit of meekness & love.

Ans. 11th. Rachel P. Brown, a member & elder of Baltimore Monthly Meeting deceased 10th mo. 27th 1883, in the 82nd year of her age.
