

Ans. 3. We believe that Friends endeavor by example & precept to bring up their children, & those under their care, in the nurture & admonition of the Lord, & in the simplicity of life which the gospel enjoins; though one report says that more care in this respect is desirable. They endeavor to guard them against pernicious teaching & corrupt conversation, & encourage them to read the Holy Scriptures.

Ans. 4. We believe Friends maintain our testimony to a free gospel ministry.

Ans. 5. With some exceptions, Friends maintain our testimony against the use of all intoxicating liquors, and avoid drinking houses, & frivolous and demoralizing places of diversion.

Ans. 6. Care has been extended to those requiring aid.

Ans. 7. Friends' children of suitable age attend school, and when practicable, schools under the care of Friends.

Ans. 8. With a few exceptions as to oaths, we believe Friends maintain our testimonies as inquired after in this Query.

Ans. 9. We believe Friends are careful to live within the bounds of their circumstances, and to avoid involving themselves in business beyond their ability to manage, or engaging in hazardous or speculative trade; that they are just in their dealings & generally punctual in complying with their engagements, &

where any give reasonable ground for fear in these respects, due care is extended to them.

Ans. 10. Care is generally taken to deal with offenders seasonably & impartially, & in the spirit of meekness & love.
