45. The following report of the Committee on the proposition from Baltimore Quarterly Meeting in regard to the times of holding meetings, &c., was read, as follows. We have approved the proposition therein contained, and the attention of the subordinate Meetings was directed to this Minute.

The Committee to which was referred the subject of the times of holding the Yearly Meeting and its subordinate Meetings, has carefully considered the whole matter, and reports as follows:

1. That it does not seem advisable to propose any change at present in the time of holding the Yearly Meeting.

2. We recommend that the Yearly Meeting suggest to Dunning's Creek Four Months' Meeting that its meeting at Carwensville, in the Sixth month, be held on the third Second day in Sixth month, if in its judgment such change of time is expedient.

3. We recommend that the Yearly Meeting suggest to Baltimore Quarterly Meeting that its meeting in Sixth month be held on the second Second day, and that its meeting in Ninth month be held as heretofore; but that it provide for the adjournment of said Meeting after the usual routine of business is completed, to reassemble at Baltimore on the day on which the Yearly Meeting convenes, at the conclusion of the Yearly Meeting on Ministry and Oversight, and that any unfinished business or any new business arising in the meanwhile, shall then be acted upon and disposed of. Also, that its meeting heretofore held at Ashton, in Fourth month, be in future held alternately at Ashton and Bendersville; the first of said meetings at Bendersville to be in Fourth month, 1894.
