The 1st, 2nd & 10th Queries were read, with the answers from the Monthly Meetings and the following summary was adopted as representing the present condition of the Meeting:

Ans. 1st. All meetings for worship & discipline have been duly held. Those on 1st day morning have been attended by our members generally. No exceptions are reported in regard to punctuality, but one report refers to small attendance in the middle of the week, one to small attendance on 1st day evenings, & one to some drowsiness. One meeting reports a satisfactory attendance in the middle of the week.

Ans. 2. We believe Friends have love one to another, in accordance with our Christian profession. Tale-bearing & detraction are discouraged. No differences known amongst us.

Ans 10. Care is usually taken to deal with offenders seasonably & impartially, & always in the spirit of meekness & love.

Newlin Smith, in which this Meeting unites, and, with the concurrence of Women's meeting, he is accordingly appointed. Our Clerks are directed to inform the Clerk of the Representative Meeting.

The inconvenience of the present time appointed for holding the Quarterly Meeting on Ministry & Oversight in 9th month, was considered, and, with the concurrence of Women Friends, the Clerk of that Meeting was directed to arrange an hour on 7th day evening, if practicable, and to notify the Clerks of the Preparative Meetings on Ministry & Oversight, if such change is made.
