

1894 "was respected even by those who opposed his course, and he was preserved through the dangers of the Civil War, though the tide of battle surged back & forth over his own fields.

"During the latter years of his life his bodily infirmities over prevented his attending meetings, but when favored to get there, he would sometimes have a message or a quotation from Scripture to those gathered with him.

"He bore his sickness with great fortitude, and died peacefully in the hope of a glorious resurrection through our Lord Jesus Christ."
