The 1st, 2nd & 10th Queries were read, with the answers from the Monthly Meetings, & the following summary answers adopted to represent the present state of this Meeting.

Ans. 1. All meetings for worship & discipline have been duly held, except two for worship at Hopewell & one at Deer Creek on account of roads being impassable, also the monthly meeting in 1st month at Patuxent, on account of the same severe snow storm. The 1st day morning meetings have been attended punctually by most of our members, but comparatively few of them have attended the 1st day evening meetings in Baltimore. These latter meetings were suspended by action of the Monthly Meeting in 2^d Mo. last under authority of the Quarterly Meeting held 9 Mo. 12. 1892, and meetings for Bible teaching have been held each 1st day evening since, with a considerably increased attendance. The attendance of the mid-week meetings has been satisfactory, except that Deer Cr. reports that the mid-week meetings have been neglected by many. Unbecoming behavior has been avoided.

Ans. 2. With one exception mentioned in one report, Friends have love one

to another in accordance with our Christian profession. Tale-bearing & detraction are discouraged, & if differences arise, endeavors are used speedily to end them.

Ans. 10. Care is usually taken to deal with offenders seasonably & impartially, and in the spirit of meekness & love.
