

Ans. 5. With a few exceptions, Friends maintain our testimony against the use of all intoxicating liquors & avoid drinking houses & demoralizing places of diversion.

Ans. 6. The circumstances of those requiring aid are inspected, & relief extended when thought necessary.

Ans. 7. Friends' children attend school and when practicable, schools under the care of Friends.

Ans. 8. Friends maintain a testimony against oaths, military services, clandestine trade, prize goods, lotteries & slavery.

Ans. 9. Friends generally appear to live within the bounds of their circumstances and to avoid involving themselves in business beyond their ability to manage or engaging in improperly speculative trade, and to be just in their dealings & punctual in complying with their engagements.

Ans. 10. Care is usually taken to deal with offenders seasonably & impartially & in the spirit of meekness & love.

Ans. 11. James Carey, an elder, died 10 mo. 8th 1894 in the 74th year of his age. Lucy M. Dewett, an elder, died 10 mo. 28. 1894, in her 75th year.
