Friends avoid unbecoming behavior therein, with slight exception in one report.

Ans. 2nd. We believe that Friends have love towards each other in accordance with our Christian profession. (One report says Most Friends) Tale-bearing & detraction are discouraged. When differences arise, endeavors are used speedily to end them.

Ans. 10th. When occasion requires, care is taken to deal with offenders

seasonably & impartially, in the spirit of meekness & love. (One report says care is usually taken)

The following report was read & the committee released.

"The committee to arrange for a conference to be held on the 7th day preceding this Quarterly Meeting, report that it was duly held. A paper on "Baptism" was read by Samuel R. Meave, & another by Dr. R. W. Thomas on "The Supper", followed by a few remarks from other Friends. The attendance was large & much interest was manifested."
