To Baltimore Monthly Meeting of Friends
Dear friends, The committee you constituted 4th Mo. 6th 1893 to promote the accommodation & comfort of the meeting in Washington (including the members resident here) has labored with much unity & satisfaction, holding regular meetings at stated intervals, with a full record of its proceedings. The following minute was entered on 12th Mo. 25th 1898 "It is the judgment of this committee that application should now be made for the establishment of a Monthly or

Preparative Meeting in Washington; the former being preferred if satisfactory to Baltimore Monthly Meeting."

This request is therefore forwarded on behalf of the Washington Friends. "
