Hopewell - As far as known, none of our members are at all addicted to the use of intoxicating liquors as a beverage, though some use them in certain cases of sickness.

Lincoln - Inquiry has been made relative to the use of intoxicating liquors by our members, and we find a few not free from their use.

Ashton - Our members appear to be clear, though one non-resident member has not replied to the inquiry of the committee.

Washington - Upon inquiry of all the members except 3 who reside at a distance, the overseers find only one who uses intoxicating liquors.

The other Monthly Meetings expect to report at our next Quarterly Meeting.

The 1st, 2nd & 10th Queries were read, with the answers from the Monthly Meetings and the following summary answers were adopted.

Ans. 1. All our meetings for worship & discipline have been held. Those on 1st day are punctually attended by most of our members. Midweek meetings are small, and one report says "Meetings for discipline are neglected by many," and another report says "More punctuality is desirable". Unbecoming behavior is avoided.

Ans. 2. Most Friends, we believe, have love one to another in accordance with our Christian profession. Tale-bearing & detraction are discouraged. Endeavors are used to terminate differences whenever they arise. Two reports state that there is no tale-bearing, detraction or difference.

Ans. 10. When necessary to deal with offenders, care is taken, when it is possible to act, to do so seasonably & impartially, & in the spirit of meekness & love; 3 reports say there have been no offenders.
