discouraged. We know our differences amongst us.  
3rd - We believe many friends endeavor by  
example and precept to bring up their children  
and those under their care in the purest and  
admiration of the Lord and to some extent in  
the pleasure of speech department and apparel  
which the Gospel enjoins. Some care is taken  
to guard them against reading pernicious  
books and from the corrupt conversation  
of the world, and they are encouraged to read  
the Holy Scriptures. But we feel that there is  
need for a more earnest Christian care in all  
these important particulars.

4th. The believe most friends maintain  
our testimony to a free gospel ministry  
a greatly to our discipline.

5th - We believe that friends are clear with  
regard to the several particulars of this  
Decree -

6th. The necessities of the press and  
the circumstances of those requiring it  
are inspected and relieved. They are

relieved and assisted in such employments  
as they are capable of when necessary. Some  
care is taken to provide for the education of  
orphan children.

7th. The believe friends are careful to live within  
the bounds of their circumstances, to avoid involving  
themselves in business beyond their ability to  
manage, or engaging in Speculations or  
speculative trade. They are clear of defrauding  
the public revenue. We believe they are just  
in their dealings and punctual in fulfilling  
their engagements.

8th Care is taken to deal with offenders as given after.
