7th Answer

Friends children are placed at school, and are practicable in schools under the care of Friends.

8th Answer

We believe Friends maintain a faithful testimony against Oaths, Military Service, clandestine trade, prize goods, lotteries and Slavery.

9th Answer

Friends appear careful to live within the bounds

of their circumstances, and avoid involving themselves in business beyond their ability to manage, or engaging in hazardous or speculative trade. They are just in their dealings and punctual in complying with their engagements.

10th Answer

When occasion requires, care is taken to deal with offenders seasonably and impartially, and in the spirit of meekness and love.
