9th Ans

Friends endeavor to live within the bounds of their circumstances, and avoid involving themselves in business beyond their ability to manage, or engaging

in hazardous or speculative trade. They are just in their dealings, and endeavor to be punctual in complying with their engagements, and when there is any reasonable ground of fear in these respects, due care is extended to them. One answer expresses a concern that we should be more cautious in regard to engaging in hazardous and speculative trade.

10th Ans.

Care is taken to deal with offenders seasonally and impartially, and when necessary, in the spirit of meekness and love.

11th Ans.
