* The minutes of last Meeting were read - The twelve queries and their answers as sent from the several Monthly Meetings were read, and the following summaries adopted.

1st Summary -

All our Meetings for worship and discipline have been duly held - more punctuality is generally desired - Unbecoming behaviour avoided.

2nd Summary -

We believe Friends have love one to another in accordance with our Christian profession, Tale-bearing and detraction discouraged - No known differences. 3rd Summary -

Friends endeavor by example and precept to bring up their children and those under their care in the nurture and admonition of the Lord, and to some extent in that simplicity of life which the Gospel enjoins - They counsel them against pernicious reading and corrupt associations, and they encourage them to read the Holy Scriptures.

4th Summary We believe Friends maintain

our testimony to a free Gospel Ministry, agreeably to our Discipline.

5th Summary. Most Friends maintain our testimony against the use of all intoxicating liquors, and generally avoid frivolous and demoralizing places of diversion.

One report says Friends generally maintain their testimony not only against the use, but the manufacture and sale of all intoxicating liquors.

6th Summary. The necessities of the poor ^{are} ~~are~~ relieved when occasion requires.

7th Summary. Friends children attend schools, and when practicable schools under the care of Friends. One report notes a deficiency as to the sixth clause of this query -
