The Subject of the establishment of select schools under
the care of the Monthly meeting referred to us by the
quarterly meeting, was brought into view by a Report
from our Committee, in substance they state, "that they
have continued their attention to this important concern
that after diligent enquiry among the families within
their meeting they regret to conclude, that if the few children
(whose habitations are much separated) could be collected,
they would be insufficient to form a reputable school;
that several of our members have within the last year or two
placed their children at West Town, Haverford, & other
schools; some removals have occurred, & others are con-
templated, so that on a survey of the whole matter
it is their judgment that the wishes of the Society cannot now
be expected to be fulfilled. In which was adopted & directed to be
forwarded to the quarterly meeting."
