

20<sup>th</sup> of Baltimore Quarterly Meeting in unity with the Ancient  
Yearly Meetings of Friends, to be held the 16<sup>th</sup> day of the 6<sup>th</sup> Mo 1836  
Dear Friends,

The first, second and ninth queries were read  
in this meeting and the following answers adopted. To wit:—

1<sup>st</sup> Ans:— All our meetings both for worship and discipline have been  
kept up, and attended, nearly as well as circumstances appeared to admit.  
Unbecoming behaviour, therein generally avoided, and the hour of meeting  
regularly observed.

2<sup>nd</sup> Ans:— Friends appear to maintain love towards each other:  
Sole bearing and detraction discouraged; and there are no apparent  
differences amongst us.

3<sup>rd</sup> Ans:— We have made but little progress, since last Quarter, in  
dealing with those who have seceded: No other known offenders  
amongst us.

"The friends of Goose Creek Meeting propose changing the place of  
holding their meeting, from Hannah Stogers where it is now held, to a  
house now building; they also request to have a Preparative Meeting granted  
them; to be called. Goose Creek Preparative Meeting in unity with the Ancient  
Yearly Meetings of Friends, with which this meeting concurs, and refers  
the subject to the Quarterly Meeting."

"We have appointed Aaron H. Griffith, John Griffith and William H.  
Brown, to attend the ensuing Quarterly Meeting as our representatives."
