

To Baltimore Quarterly Meeting to be held the 15th of 9^{mo} 1836. Dear friends 3

The Queries read in this Meeting and the following answers, concluded on to wit.

1st Ans. - All our Meetings, both for worship and discipline, have been attended by a considerable portion of our Members; but a more lively zeal in the performance of that important duty, is desirable: unbecoming behaviour mostly avoided, and the hour of Meeting nearly observed.

2nd Ans. - Friends appear to maintain love towards each other. Tale bearing and detraction discouraged; and there are no differences amongst us.

3rd Ans. - Some friends endeavour, by precept and example, to train up their children in plainness of speech behaviour and apparel; to guard them against reading pernicious books and to encourage them to read the ^{Holy} Scriptures.

4th Ans. - Our testimony against spiritous liquors, is maintained by most. Taverns are not frequently unnecessarily, and modulation mostly adhered to.

5th Ans. - No poor amongst us, requiring aid.

6th Ans. - Friends appear to maintain the testimonies enjoined by this Query.

7th Friend appear careful to live within the bounds of their circumstances, and to avoid involving themselves in business beyond their ability to manage: They appear just in their dealings and mostly punctual in fulfilling their engagements.

8th Ans. - Friends endeavour to fulfil the duties, enjoined by this Query.

9th Ans. - Care is taken to deal with offenders nearly as recommended. 10th Ans. - None. 11th Ans. - None.

12th Ans. - Friends endeavour, as far as practicable, to comply with the requisitions of this Query.
