1st Ans. All our Meetings for worship and discipline
have been held. Those on first day Mornings are
generally well attended, but other Meetings are fre-
quently neglected by many - Unbecoming behaviour
therein is mostly avoided, and the hour of Meeting
nearly observed by most Friends.

2nd Ans. Friends generally maintain love towards each
other becoming our Christian profession. Tale bearing
and detraction are discouraged, and when differences
arise endeavours are used to end them.

3rd Ans. Most Friends endeavour by example and
precept to educate their children and those under
their care, in plainness of Speech deportment and
