which being read and considered is united with, and the friends named in the report as suitable persons to superintend the building of the meeting house are appointed to that service and the former committee having performed the service assigned them are released except Gerard T. Hopkins and Thomas Ellicott, who are continued to use their endeavours to obtain further subscriptions and to make the collections from the subscribers, when necessary, and as the same is collected pay the money over to the Committee, or to their Treasurer.

11th of the 10th Month 1804

The committee appointed to superintend the building intended for Friends meeting house, report, that the sum originally subscribed for that object amounted to \$9,230, the whole of which has been expended except \$945. which is not yet collected, and that they have made all the contracts necessary for completing the building, & find from as exact an estimate, as can now be made, that the total expence will be \$13,230, of which sum \$4,000 remain deficient, — Therefore this meeting appoints, John McLean, Philip C. Thomas, Thomas Ellicott and Amos James, to open a

25 Subscription, for the aforesaid \$4000, and as the money will be shortly wanted, they are requested to pay early attention thereto, — 8th of the 11th Month 1804 —

The committee appointed to procure subscriptions to finish the new meeting house, inform, that they have attended to the service, & made considerable exertions to obtain the money necessary, but that they had not been able to do anything to effect, they are continued to use further endeavours to obtain the money & report to our next.

13th of the 12th Month 1804

The Committee appointed to receive subscriptions for the new meeting house at the west end of this city reported that they have attended to the service & had obtained subscriptions to the amount of \$1845, and they further informed that they have no prospect of being able to obtain a further sum by voluntary contributions at this time. Which being considered the meeting unites in judgement, that for the purpose of raising the money — the following named friends are appointed to dispose of so much of the lot of ground fronting on Great Port street, as will be sufficient to cover the deficiency, unless some other manner of obtaining the money should present, to wit, James Gillingham, William Scrimble, Elias Ellicott, William Brown, and William Riley, who are directed to make report, to our next.
