The committee appointed to dispose of a part of our meeting land, reports, that they had disposed of four lots fronting on Great York street, of 28 feet each, and Dup for the sum of, \$2680 payable at 3^d 6 months. The same friends are continued to furnish the Treasurer of the Building Committee with the money, as it may become payable or such part thereof as may be necessary, & to attend to having the Deed of conveyance made to the Purchaser, after the money is paid, & to report to this meeting when ready.

14th of the 5th Month 1807.

The Committee appointed sometime since to superintend the building of our meeting house, in the west end of this city — produced the following report, which was satisfactory & they released.
