We the committee to whom was referred the minute from the Western District monthly meeting respecting their appointment to the care and oversight of our Burying Grounds — Having had the subject under our consideration, we are of opinion, that the conclusion of our last monthly meeting respecting the property was full and clear: nevertheless it is our sense, that friends of that monthly meeting be at liberty, to enter in our Grounds as heretofore, subject to the direction and order, established by our monthly meeting, Which we submit to the meeting.
