

Proposed Connection for care of Burying Grounds.

14th of the 11th Month 1811.

The following communication was received from the Monthly meeting for the Western District.

"The following named friends were appointed to have charge of the Funerals, which may occur within our district, to grant orders for Interments and to unite with a committee of Friends of the Eastern District in the care of the Burying Grounds, viz. John Marsh, William Pilupp, Isaac Procter, Amos James, and Samuel S. Jones, in the clerk was directed to furnish the Monthly meeting for the Eastern District with a copy of this minute, signed on behalf of this meeting."

12th of the 12th Month 1811.

The friends appointed on the communication from the Monthly Meeting for the Western District were continued.

9th of the 1st Month 1812.

The friends appointed produced the following report which was united with — viz.

"We the committee appointed on the communication from the Monthly Meeting of Baltimore for the Western District, Report,

That we have conferred on the subject and it is our judgment that agreeably to Discipline and the order of Society, Monthly Meetings are separately accountable for a due exercise of care in the management of their concerns, and that the appointment of a committee to unite with theirs in the care of the Burying Ground would be a departure therefrom, & not tend to promote harmony amongst friends."
