

Subject of Titles.

7th Month 12th 1810

John Trimble informed that having removed within the limits of the monthly meeting for the Western District, proposed that a friend should be named to succeed him as one of the trustees to this monthly meeting, and it appearing that there are also other trustees now without the limits of this meeting Joseph Townsend, William Brown, David Wilson and Popiter Scott were appointed to consider the subject and report their sense thereon to our next.

9th of the 8th month 1810

The committee appointed on the request of John Trimble to be released from serving as a trustee, informed they had made some progress but were not prepared to report fully. they were continued.

13th of the 9th month 1810

The friends on the request of John Trimble to be released from serving as a trustee were continued.

11th of the 10th month 1810

The friends on the request of John Trimble informed that having found it necessary to take Council in the case from which it appeared that no conveyance was necessary at this time which was referred for further consideration to our next.

8th of the 11th month 1810

The friends on the request of John Trimble were discontinued.

14th of the 11th month 1811

It appearing that most of the legal trustees of the property belonging to this meeting

are deceased John Trimble, Joseph Townsend, John S. Pick, William Husband, John Wilson, Edward Waters and John McKim were appointed to take the subject into consideration and report their prospect thereon to a future sitting of this meeting.

21st of 11th month adjourned meeting.

The friends appointed produced the following. We the committee appointed report.

That we have had under consideration the circumstance of the property belonging to this meeting as also a reference to the Discipline respecting the preserving of titles and are of the opinion, that from the reduced number of the legal trustees, that an early application be made to the legislature now in session for an act to continue the said trust and have accordingly prepared the following memorial.

We are also free to propose that John Trimble, John Dukehart, William Husband, Ely Balderston, Thomas Matthews, David Brown, and William Procter receive
