10th of 12th Month 1812

The friends appointed to present the Memorial
to the legislature were continued

14th of 1st Month 1813

The friends appointed to present the memorial
to the legislature informed they had attended
to the subject but not being in readiness to
make a full report were continued

11th of 2d Month 1813

The friends appointed produced the following
report and act of the Legislature vid

We the committee appointed report

That a certified copy of the memorial was
forwarded to the late General Assembly, accom-
panied with a Bill drawn conformably thereto,
which was enacted into a law without any
material alteration - investing in the friends
proposed a continuation of the trusts agreeably
to the Original intention - a copy whereof is
in readiness for the further direction of the
meeting

An act vesting the property therein men-
tioned in certain trustees for the use and benefit

of the Society of Friends or people called Quakers
constituting the Monthly Meeting of Baltimore for
the Eastern District in the City of Baltimore

Whereas by an act of the General Assembly
of Maryland, passed at November session one
thousand seven hundred and ninety three
Entitled "an act to confirm the title of certain
lots of ground to the Society of people called
Quakers in Baltimore Town, wherein is their
Meeting house and burying ground" reciting
among other things that it was represented to
the Legislature by the Monthly Meeting of
people called Quakers in Baltimore Town, that
they were seized and possessed of a lot of
grounds on the East side of Jones's falls in-
cluded within York, Harford and Pitt Streets
and Smock Alley containing by computation
near four acres, which was purchased by
the said Society before the revolution for the
purpose of erecting a meeting house, yard &
stabling, Burying ground and school house
and a small piece of said lot to accommodate
a school master or some person to be em-
ployed in taking care of said premises with
a house and garden it was enacted that
it should and might be lawful for the
trustees of said Society to have and to
