 "Meeting, with a view to avoid troubling the
 "legislature in future, when such appointments
 "should become necessary."

"And we feel a
 "hope, that upon due reflection your meeting
 "will become satisfied, with the correctness of the
 "proceeding."

Which was united with, and

 and John Trimble were appointed to attend
 the monthly meeting for the Western District
 with the minutes requested and a copy of this,
 which the Clerk was directed to sign on behalf
 of the meeting and ^{of their care} report to our next

 "being communicated to this meeting, that upon
 "an application on the part of the monthly
 "meeting for the Eastern District, to the legislature
 "of this state, a law has been obtained, relative
 "to the burial ground belonging to friends in
 "this city, which it was believed altered the
 "tenure by which the property was held; our
 "meeting accordingly appointed a committee to
 "investigate the subject, who after enquiry reported,
 "that the information was correct, and that it
 "was their united judgement, that our privileges
 "in the property are thereby abridged — which
 "being considered, the minds of friends belonging
 "to our meeting not being easy with the
 "situation in which the property appears now
 "to be placed we have concluded to recall
