The following communication was received from the Monthly Meeting of Baltimore for the Western District, which was read and referred to the following friends who are desired to report thereon to a future sitting (to wit) John Trimble, Joseph Townsend, John S. Peck, Ely Balderston, David Wilson, John Wilson and William Procter — (Vrs)

"The friends appointed at last meeting produced the following report, which was read and united with, and directed to be forwarded to the Quarterly meeting, Thomas Moore, Philip E. Thomas, Samuel J. Jones, Andrew Ellicott, Andrew McCoy, William Riley and Thomas Ellicott were appointed to attend therewith, on behalf of this meeting, and report of their care therein at a future meeting the Clerk was also directed to furnish the monthly meeting for the Eastern District with a copy of the report and of this minute.

"It appears that of the property in the East end of the City belonging to friends. Two lots were bought in the year 1773 from John Deaver and Andrew Steiger and conveyed to John Cornthwaite and Gerard Hopkins, another lot was purchased in the year 1778 from Andrew Steiger and conveyed to John

Cornthwaite, Robert Cornthwaite, George Matthews and David Brown, in 1793 one other lot was purchased from William and Mary Young and conveyed to John McKim and Joseph Townsend, which latter recited conveyance was only for a small piece of ground of about 1900 Square feet"

"The two first deeds conveyed in trust for the use of the society of people called Quakers, inhabiting and dwelling in and near the town and County of Baltimore in the province of Maryland for a burial place and meeting house &c, the third deed conveyed for the use of the society of people called Quakers inhabiting and dwelling in and near Baltimore Town for the same purposes and the fourth deed conveyed in trust for the use of the society of people called Quakers and for the purpose of being occupied as a meeting house and burial ground for the society —"

"In the year 1800 Gerard Hopkins, Robert Cornthwaite, George Matthews, David Brown, John Deaver, John McKim, Joseph Townsend, parties to the before mentioned several deeds of trust conveyed by direction of Baltimore Monthly Meeting to Gerard T. Hopkins, Isaac Tyson, John Duckhart and John Trimble (of Isaac) in trust for the use of the society of people
