It is enacted that it shall be lawful for the
trustees of said society (to wit the monthly
Meeting of friends then existing in Baltimore
town) to hold the property and lots therein
mentioned to them their heirs and assigns
forever provided that the said property
shall be held and enjoyed for a meeting
house, yard, stabling, Burying ground, School
house and dwelling house, and small
garden, to accommodate said School master
or person taking care of said property, and
for no other use, intent, or purpose whatever.

The above contains a short abstract of the title to the
property held by the Society of Friends in Baltimore
on the East side of Jones's Falls After a careful
consideration and review of the whole of the said
title papers, I am of opinion that the foregoing
trustees hold the property for the sole and exclusive
use and benefit of the Society of Friends, who
frequent and assemble at the meeting house on the
Eastern side of Jones's Falls according to the terms
and provisions of the act of Assembly; and that no

other society of friends have a right to interfere with
or controul them in the use and enjoyment of
this property

No conveyance can be made by any
of the present trustees, unless by the authority of
an act of the Legislature passed for that par-
ticular purpose signed
