Extract of Richard Taylors will
May 18th 1729.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son
Joseph Taylor, a lot of land containing one
acre of land, bought of John Ensor for to
build a Meeting house on it — the said land
and the house that is on it I give and bequeath

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for the use of Friends — for the use of a
Meeting house and burying place for Friends
forever and Quakers so called. —

Recorded in Liber **B** folio 187.

Extract of the Will of Joseph Taylor
April 19th 1788.

I give and bequeath unto my cousin
Richard Taylor and Samuel Taylor (sons
of Thomas Taylor) and Joseph Daughdy and
my friend John Hopkins, and their heirs forever.
all my one acre of Land called Friendship,
whereon our Meeting house was built for the use
of Friends for the ^{Public} Worship of Almighty God.
