aforesaid one Acre of Land, occasioned by the
circumstance of friends having removed their
Meeting into the City of Baltimore the Meeting
for Sufferings considered it necessary to take
counsel thereon, and the following was accor-
dingly obtained. — "By the Devises made by
Richard Taylor and Joseph Taylor. Richard
Taylor, Samuel Taylor, Joseph Daughdy and
John Hopkins, became seized in fee, of the one
Acre of Land in those wills mentioned, in trust for
the friends for the use of a Meeting house and
burying ground. — The friends having removed
their Meeting house to Town, will not injure
their right, provided it has been occasionally
used as a burying ground by them — but
if it has been for a long time past deserted

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by the Society, and neither used for the pur-
pose of a Meeting house or burying ground
and other persons have used and occupied
the place, the Society may probably have
lost that Equitable right in it which they
once had." —
