This Indenture made this Twenty fourth day of December in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred. Between William. Armitage of the City of Baltimore, of the one part and Gerard. T. Hopkins, Isaac Tyson, John Dutchart and John Trimble, (of Isaac) of the same place, Trustees for the congregation of people called Quakers, in the city of Baltimore of the other part Witnesseth that the said William Armitage for and in consideration of the sum of Sixty Dollars, current money to him in hand

paid by the said Gerard. T. Hopkins, Isaac Tyson, John Dutchart, and John Trimble (of Isaac) at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged. He hath granted, bargained, sold, aliened, enfeoffed, conveyed and confirmed and by these presents doth grant, bargain, sell, alien, enfeoff, convey and confirm unto the said Gerard. T. Hopkins, Isaac Tyson, John Dutchart and John Trimble (of Isaac) their heirs and assigns, All that piece or parcel of ground which is contained within the metes, bounds, courses and distances following to Wit Beginning for the same at a stone set down at the East corner of the friends burying ground, and running thence West bounding a line of the same seven feet six inches, thence South forty eight
