the North seventy degrees East ten Perch line of
John Deavers and acre lot and running from
the said stone South Seventeen degrees East, eight
and a half perches, then South Seventy three
degrees West seven perches, then North Seventeen
degrees West eight and a half perches, then with
a straight line to the place of beginning, containing
fifty nine and half square perches of land. to the
same more or less together with all and singular
the ways Water and Watercourses, right Liberties,
privileges, advantages hereditaments and appur-
tenances thereto belonging or in any ways appertain-
ing To have and To Hold the said piece or
parcell of Land, hereditaments and premises hereby
granted, or mentioned or intended to be hereby

given and granted and every part thereof with
the appurtenances unto the said John Smithwick
and Gerard Hopkins, their heirs executors, Admin-
istrators for and to the use ^{to} and purposes Follow-
ing, that is to say for the use of the Society of
Christian people called Quakers inhabiting and
dwelling in and near the Town and County of
Baltimore in the province aforesaid To Enclose
and Keep the same for a Burying Place to bury
or inter those of the same Society that may
from time to time depart this life, and also
to erect or build a meeting house for the same
Society and People, for the public Worship of
Mighty God, and other business concerning
the affairs of the said Society of People called
Quakers, according to the custom and manner
used and Practised by the said Society and
People
