Before us the Subscribers two of the Justices of the Peace for said County came Andrew Stigar and acknowledged the within Indenture of Bargain and Sale to be his Act and Deed according to the true Intent and meaning thereof, and the Lands and Premises within mentioned to be bargained and sold to be the Right, Title, Interest, Estate and Property of the within named John Cornthwaite, Robert Cornthwaite, George Mathews, and David Brown their heirs, Executors, administrators, Successors and Assigns for the Uses and Purposes within mentioned forever. Also came Mary the Wife of the said Andrew Stigar and being by us privately examined apart from and out of the hearing of her said Husband did acknowledge all his Right of Power of in and to the within Bargained Lands and Premises with

all and every the Appurtenances to be the Right, Title Interest Estate and Property of the within named John Cornthwaite, Robert Cornthwaite, George Mathews and David Brown for the uses and purposes within mentioned, And at the same time did declare, That she made such acknowledgment of her own free and voluntary will and accord without being thereto compelled or induced by any fears threats or ill Usage of her said Husband or through fear of his displeasure.
