Adjourned Meeting.

The Law passed at the
late Session of Assembly, confirming the Title
to our Meeting house Ground, was produced,
read, and is as follows.

Session 1793 Chap. 20th

An Act, To confirm the Title of certain Lots
of Ground to the Society of People called Quakers,

in Baltimore Town, wherein is their Meeting
house and Burying Ground.

1st Whereas, it is represented to this Legislature
by the Monthly Meeting of the people called Quakers,
in Baltimore Town, that they are seized, and
possessed of a Lot of Ground on the East side of Lewis
Falls included within Mark, Housford and Pitt Streets
and Hancock Alley, containing by computation
near four Acres, which was purchased by said
Society before the revolution, for the purpose of
Erecting a Meeting house, yard, Stabling, burying
Ground and school house, and a small piece of
said lot to accommodate a school master, or some
person to be employed in taking care of said premises,
with a house and garden. And Whereas it ap-
pears by the bill of rights that no Religious
