

Baltimore Monthly Meeting held
the 13th of the 12th Month 1804

The committee appointed to receive subscriptions to
finish the new meeting house at the west end of this
city, reported that they had obtained subscriptions
to the amount of one thousand eight hundred and
forty three dollars, ^{see page 113} and they further informed
that they have no prospect of being able to
obtain a further sum by voluntary contribution
at this time. Which being considered, the meeting
unites in judgment that for the purpose of raising
the money the following named Friends are
appointed to dispose of so much of the lot of
ground fronting on Great York street, as will
be sufficient to cover the deficiency, unless some

other manner of obtaining the money should
present, to wit, James Hittingham, William
Trimble, Elias Ellicott, William Brown and
William Riley, who are directed to make re-
port to our next.

In consequence of the foregoing appointment,
the committee applied to the Legislature, and
the following Law was Enacted.

An Act, authorising the persons therein
named to dispose of certain ground belonging
to the Society of Quakers in the city of
Baltimore.
