

and beneficial manner to all intents and purposes, whatsoever, as the said George Everhart might or could have held and enjoyed the same by any ways or means whatsoever: Subject to the payment of the yearly rent in sum of Five Pounds ten shillings current money: In Trust and for the several uses intents and purposes therein and herein after mentioned that is to say. In the first place - that the said part of a lot of ground ^{together} with any buildings or improvements that might be erected thereon should be, and continue to be, for the use and service of the ^{Society or} congregation of People called Quakers in the city of Baltimore; and upon this further Trust, that the said Trustees or survivor of them when thereto required, should by a good and sufficient deed ^{convey} and assign the said part of ^{a lot of} ground and premises, to such person or persons, and to and for such

uses and purposes, as might and should be appointed limited and agreed upon by a Baltimore Monthly Meeting of the said congregation, when convened agreeably to the rules and regulations of the said Society. Provided Always, that neither the said James Ellicott, Philip E. Thomas, William Tyson, John Ellicott Junr. James Gillingham and John Marsh, or any person or persons succeeding them in that trust who should thereafter fall from or change his or their ~~religious~~ religious principles aforesaid or depart from the said congregation, or who should cease to be a member or members thereof, should be capable to execute that trust or stand seized to the uses aforesaid, nor have any right or interest in the said premises anything therein contained to the contrary notwithstanding.
