

society or Congregation of People residing in the said city;
 and upon this further trust that the said John Talbott,
 John Dutchart, John Jewitt, William Gillingham, Samuel
 Ellicott and Isaac Tyson Sr., or the survivors or survivor of
 them or the heirs executors or administrators of the survivor
 when thereto required, shall by a good and sufficient
 deed, convey and transfer the said pieces or parcels of
 ground and premises, to such person or persons and to
 and for such uses and purposes, as may and shall be
 appointed limited and agreed upon by a Monthly Meet-
 -ing of the Society of People called Quakers, in the City
 of Baltimore, with the approbation of the yearly Meeting
 of said Society or its representatives duly appointed. ---

Provided. Always that neither the said John
 Talbott, John Dutchart, John Jewitt, William Gillingham,

Samuel Ellicott, and Isaac Tyson Sr. nor any person or
 persons succeeding them in this trust, who shall hereafter
 fall from or change his or their religious principles aforesaid,
 or depart from the said congregation, or who shall cease
 to be a member or members thereof, shall be capable to execute
 this trust or stand seized to the uses aforesaid, or have any
 right or interest in the said premises: anything herein
 contained, to the contrary thereof, in anywise notwith-
 standing. ---
