

To the General Assembly of Maryland.

The Memorial of the Society of Friends
constituting Baltimore Monthly Meeting latterly dis-
tinguished for the Eastern District in the City of Baltimore.
Respectfully represents.

That in the years 1773. 1775. 1786. and 1793. The
Society purchased several small lots or parcels of ground
situate in the East end of the City, west of Harford and
between York and Pitt streets, which was conveyed to
John Cornthwaite, Gerard Hopkins, and others in Trust,
for the use and benefit of the said Society, and which
was afterwards confirmed to them by an Act of the Legis-
lature, passed at November Session 1793. for the
following purposes viz. For a Meeting house, yard,
stabling, burying ground, school house and small

garden, to accommodate said school-master, or other person
taking care of said property."

That your Memorialists further
state, that since the passing of said act, most of the
aforesaid Trustees are deceased, and a necessity appear-
ing for a renewal thereof, they therefore request, that
a law may pass, investing the said Trust, in the
following members of said Monthly Meeting —
John Trimble, John Dutchant, William Husband,
Ely Balderston, Thomas Matthews, David Brown
and William Proctor, to be held by them for the
several purposes mentioned, agreeably to the origi-
nal Intention.
