This Indenture, made the twentieth day of June in the year of our Lord, one thousand seven hundred and ninety four, between John Brown and John M. Hine both of Baltimore County in the State of Maryland, of the one part, and Joseph Townsends and Thomas Peabody, of the same County and State, William Ballinger of Frederick County and State aforesaid, Eli Sells of York Town in the State of Pennsylvania, Isaac Peirce of Loudon County in the State of Virginia, and Joseph Stee of the County of Frederick in the said State of Virginia of the other part. Whereas James Shown by his Indenture of bargain and sale bearing date on or about the thirty first day of May in the year seventeen hundred and ninety two for the therein consideration, did grant, bargain, sell, release and confirm unto the said John Brown and John M. Hine their heirs and assigns all those pieces or parcels of the tract of land called Harley Hall distinguished on the plat thereof by the numbers seventy three and eighty five. Beginning for numbers seventy three at the distance of twenty perches south forty degrees west from the intersection of a road laid out through Harley Hall south fifty degrees east, and the third road to the northward of the road that leads from Baltimore Town to Smiths Mill, and run thence south forty degrees west twenty perches, thence north fifty degrees west thirty two perches north forty degrees east twenty perches and thence by a straight line to the beginning.
