

Beginning for number eighty five at the intersection of the road running south fifty degrees east and the fourth road to the northward of the road that leads from Baltimore Town to Smiths Mill and running thence south forty degrees west twenty perches north fifty degrees west twenty one perches to the fifth line of the whole tract; then bounding thence north fifteen degrees and thirty minutes east twenty two perches to the second line mentioned, and then by a straight line to the place of beginning, also all that piece a part of the said tract of land called Parly Hall distinguished on the plot thereof by the numbers eighty four, eighty two, eighty three, seventy one and seventy two, and beginning for the same at the end of the north thirteen degrees and a half east sixty six perches corner of the whole tract, and running thence south sixty seven and an half degrees east binding on the sixth line of the said tract eighty perches thence south fifty degrees west twenty two perches thence south fifty degrees east thirty two perches to a road, thence south forty degrees west forty three perches, thence north fifty degrees west thirty two perches thence north fifty degrees east twenty perches thence north fifty degrees west sixty five and an half perches to intersect the north thirteen and a half degrees east sixty six perches line of the whole tract, then binding on that line to the beginning with three and every of their appurtenances. *It* *Agrees* and *It* *Holds* the one moiety or half part thereof, with their appurtenances unto the said John Brown his heirs and assigns to the only proper use and behoof of the said John Brown his heirs and assigns, and *It* *Agrees* and *It* *Holds* the other moiety or residue thereof with the appurtenances unto the said John McLean his heirs and assigns to the

only proper use and behoof of the said John McLean his heirs and assigns, as by the said in part recited Indenture duly executed acknowledged and recorded among the Land records of Baltimore County in Liber No. 11. 26. folio 381st reference being thereto had will more fully appear. * And whereas by a certain act of the General Assembly of the said State of Maryland made and passed at a session of the said Assembly begun and held at the City of Annapolis on the fifth day of November seventeen hundred and ninety two, entitled "An act to enable John McLean and John Brown of Baltimore County to convey certain lands to the use therein mentioned." It was among other things enacted that the leave of the Legislature shall be and is hereby granted and the said John McLean and John Brown shall be and they are hereby authorized to convey to such persons as the said Society of people called Quakers shall elect and appoint the above mentioned tract or parcel of land in trust for the use of the said religious Society of people called Quakers as a pasture in fee simple forever and for no other use or purpose whatsoever than for a pasture. And whereas the said Society of people called Quakers at a yearly Meeting held at Baltimore Town for Maryland and the adjacent parts of Virginia and Pennsylvania did nominate and appoint the above named Joseph Townsend, Thomas Pentney, William Ballinger, Eli Hink, Isaac Pannoy and Joseph Stier Trustees for the purposes in the said in part recited act mentioned. Now this Indenture witnesseth that the said John Brown and John McLean in pursuance of the said act and also for and in consideration of the sum of twenty five pounds current money of Maryland to them
