

Passed 22nd Decr. 1792.

An Act to enable John M. Kim and John Brown, of Baltimore County, to convey certain lands to the uses therein mentioned.

Lib. J. G. N. 1 fol 574.

Whereas, by the declaration of rights, all gifts, sales, or devises of Land, exceeding two acres, to any religious sect or denomination, for the support, use, interest, or benefit of, or in trust for, the same, are declared void, without the leave of the Legislature. And Whereas the said John M. Kim and John Brown have presented to this General Assembly, that they are seized and possessed of part of a tract of Land, called Hanley Hall, lying in Baltimore County, containing about thirty acres, and that they are willing and desirous to convey the same to the use of the religious Society of People called Quakers in Baltimore Town, as a pasture, if authorized so to do by the Legislature.

2nd Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, that the leave of the Legislature shall be and is hereby granted, and the said John M. Kim and John Brown shall be and they are hereby authorized to convey to such persons as the said Society of People called Quakers shall direct and appoint, the above mentioned tract or parcels of Land in trust, for the use of the said religious Society of People called Quakers, as a pasture in fee simple forever - and for no other use or purposes whatever than for a pasture.
