Gilbert Congdon of Providence, in the County of Providence and State of Rhode Island son of John, Han and Elizabeth Congdon of Providence aforesaid, and Mary R. Hopkins daughter of Samuel and Hannah Hopkins (the former deceased) of Anne Arundel County State of Maryland, having in writing laid their intentions of marriage with each other, before a Monthly Meeting of the religious Society of Friends held at Baltimore, and having consent of surviving parents, their said proposal of marriage was allowed of by the said meeting.

Now these are to certify whom it may concern, that for the full accomplishment of their said intentions, this fourteenth day of the twelfth month in the year of our Lord One Thousand eight hundred and forty two, they the said Gilbert Congdon and Mary R. Hopkins appeared in a meeting of the said people, held at Baltimore and the said Gilbert Congdon taking the said Mary R. Hopkins by the hand, did openly declare "that he took her, the said Mary R. And moreover they, the said Gilbert Congdon and Mary R. Hopkins (she according to the custom of marriage assuming the latter name of her husband) did as a further confirmation thereof then & there to these presents set their hands
