

14) In addition^{2N} to the foregoing, we have reason to believe, that under every circumstance the Yearly meeting came to a judicious conclusion, & what the monthly meeting for the Eastern District was satisfied with. — Has the monthly meeting for the Western District put that construction thereon as we apprehend was intended. — but the reverse appearing, it became necessary for the Eastern district to furnish them with their Ideas respecting it, as is contained in the information to that meeting in the 6th MS last, — the result of which was, not to deprive that meeting of any privilege that they were entitled to by the conclusion of the Yearly Meeting.

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but it was not conceived that they were authorised thereby to grant Permits for Interments for those which has not a right in society. — A class of citizens residing in and near Baltimore more numerous than those in Membership, and who occasionally attend meetings, but belong to no Religious Sect. — when such Decease, Applications has been made by their connections, for Interment in friends ground. — And though considerable Indulgence has hitherto been exercised towards such Characters, yet in the present Instance, ^{where} the monthly meeting ~~meeting~~ for the Western District is allowed the "Liberty to inter their deceases" — subject only to "their proportionable part" of the Expences that may be incurred in ^{keeping}
